### **LUKE 23:44-47 (NASB)**

**INSIGHT:** We tend to die as we have lived!

#### I. JESUS MODELED HOW TO DIE WELL.

- 1. He was at peace with His time to die.
- 2. He wasn't afraid to die.
- 3. He died with no unreconciled relationships.
- 4. He wasn't angry or bitter.
- 5. He knew where He was going, confident of heaven.
- 6. He trusted God with His future.

#### II. THE THEOLOGY OF CHRIST'S DEATH

1. He willingly gave His life.

**REALITY:** The shadow of the Cross fell across the manger of His birth (Hebrews 10:5 LB; John 10:18).

**TRUTH:** Christ's death on the Cross wasn't a tragedy but a choice.

- 2. He gave His life boldly.
- 3. He gave His life having confidence in God (Psalm 31:5).

**TRUTH:** At the height of His suffering, Jesus focused on God, not His pain.

## **III. TRUTHS FOR OUR DARK DAYS**

1. You have a "Father in heaven" who cares (John 16:28).

\*The Bible says God is caring, "Come to Me all you who are heavy laden;" consistent, "I will never leave you nor forsake you;" and close "Draw near to Me and I will draw near to you" (Psalm 103:13).

**TRUTH:** God loves you more than you love yourself.

2. God is faithful.

**TRUTH:** Inconsistent fathers produce insecure children.

THE DECISION OF TODAY: Who will you trust in this life?

TRUTH: God will always tell you the truth (Psalm 33:4 NLT)!

**QUESTION:** What do you need to give God this morning?

ANSWER: Anything you're worrying about!

3. God handles what we put in His hands (2 Timothy 1:12).

**TRUTH:** We don't do the keeping; God does!

TRUTH: It's God's job to keep you saved, to get you to heaven (2 Timothy 1:12).

4. God works in the dark night of your soul.

**TRUTH:** While you wait in the dark, God works in your behalf... Your part is to trust (Job 23:9-10)!

**TRUTH:** Today's dark time in your life is a test, and God is taking care of things you can't see that need to be addressed.

#### TRUTH ABOUT GOD'S HANDS:

- a) Big enough to bless you
- b) Big enough to keep you forever
- c) Scarred so He cannot forget you (Isaiah 49:15)
